Passing of the Feather

Over the years, I have heard rumblings from time to time of doing away with Chapter Ordeals in favor of a more centralized Lodge Ordeal system. The arguments for this change to how Jaccos Towne Lodge operates have been many. Some of them even have merit. I, for one, have never agreed with this idea. I feel there are numerous benefits to the smaller ordeals that result from having one at each Chapter.

On the one hand, we could probably run the event more cost effectively if there were just one Lodge Ordeal in the spring and another in the fall. But that savings would be more than offset by the springtime preparation and repairs to various council camps that would not be addressed if we were all at one camp for one weekend.

I do not bring these thoughts to revive discussion or conflict. Rather, I visit this concept as a motivation for us to prove, in this "Year of the Lodge" that our Lodge is only as strong as our Chapters. To illustrate that increased participation and strength of the Lodge is dependent on the efforts of those same Chapters. Now I want you, my Brothers, to help me prove it.

Here is my thought and plan. Chapters are more local. They have more personal impact on the Arrowmen and Candidates that they serve. The Lodge has a great deal to offer in programs, personal leadership development and the development of council-wide friendships that grow outside of OA and may last a lifetime.

In this "Year of the Lodge", I ask that each Chapter strive to gather as many Candidates as possible, and provide the absolute best Ordeal experience that you can as each of you do every year. Nothing different here. Right?

Here is where I want to try something new. As your Ordeal weekend comes to a close and in the months following, I would like for each Chapter to develop a strategy to get at least 50% of their new Arrowmen to attend, as a group, at least one of the fall Lodge events. I feel this "Introduction" if you will, is the best way to show the new Arrowmen from your Chapter (as well as some of the more seasoned Brothers) what the Lodge has to offer and how much fun the Lodge events can be. It will be like a bring-a-friend concept. Or maybe a group field trip mentality.

That is my challenge. Year of the Lodge! Let's see how much impact we can make on the attendance at our fall events this year.

Vigil Nominations Due at March 16th LEC



The Vigil Honor is reserved for those Arrowmen who. by reason of exceptional service, personal effort, and unselfish interest. have made distinguished contributions beyond the immediate responsibilities of their position or office to one or more of the following: their lodge, the Order of the Arrow, Scouting, or their Scout Camp. The candidate <u>must</u> be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America AND a dues-paid member of the Lodge. To nominate someone for the Vigil Honor, the nominator must fill out and submit a completed National Vigil Petition AND a Vigil Guide Form.

All Nomination and guide forms are due at the March LEC to either the Vigil Chair or Erik Wickizer. The Vigil Selection Meeting will start at 3:00 p.m. Sunday, April 6th at the Golden-Burke Scout Center. All Chapters are asked to send two members who are not eligible for Vigil, preferably one who is already Vigil. The committee would like the names of these Arrowmen by the March LEC.

2014 Order of the Arrow High Adventure



Philmont Trail Crew

The program is a fourteen (14) day experience. The first week focuses on trail construction and maintenance under the guidance of Philmont OA Trail Crew Foremen. The second week is a seven day backpacking trek that is designed by the participants. The program is not simply building trail and hiking though, the OA Trail Crew is ultimately a journey that challenges Scouts mentally, physically, and spiritually.

Ocean Adventure

This ten day program will provide an array of service opportunities that include work helping to develop the Florida Keys Heritage Trail, removing invasive species in and around the Sea Base's Big Munson Island, and supporting both the Crane Point Nature Center and Marathon Wild Bird Center in preserving the Keys flora, fauna and wildlife. You will be camping at both Big Munson Island and Crane Point during the service portion of the program, after which you will move aboard a 40-50' sailing yacht for four days at sea. While afloat, you will experience the fun and excitement of life in the Keys from the unique perspective of a sailor as you sail, snorkel on pristine coral reefs, troll for sportfish, and swim in the warm waters of the Keys.

Wilderness Voyage

The OA Voyage program is inspired by the traditions of the French Voyageurs who ventured the northern wilderness during the 1700-1800's. Traveling thousands of miles by water and portage, these Voyageurs were hired to haul goods and furs to trade with Native Americans and Europeans. In the spirit of these adventurers, Arrowmen will embark on a voyage that is twofold.

One-half of the OA Northern Tier Wilderness Voyage focuses on portage trail and campsite maintenance within the Boundary Waters. The remaining expedition is spent on a canoeing adventure that is planned and chosen by the participants in the program.

Canadian Odyssey

The Quetico Provincial Park is a vast wilderness with over 600 lakes set inside more than a million acres. The Canadian Odyssey allows Arrowmen, returning and new participants alike, to see and explore entirely new territory while at the same time providing crucial service. Odyssey crews will labor to repair and maintain portage trails in Ontario during the first week. The second week they will paddle back to the United States on a route of their choosing.

The Order of the Arrow Summit Experience program is an eight-day adventure at The Summit Bechtel Family National Scout Reserve bordering the New River Gorge National River Area. While experiencing over 10,000 acres of adventure, you have the opportunity to explore the Summit like no one else, while blazing trail with the first year of the Order of the Arrow Summit Experience Program.

Four days of the program will be focused on building or maintaining trail around the Summit, and the New River Gorge National River Area. The remainder of the experience will revolve around white water kayaking and rafting, along with mountain biking, climbing, and participation in other Summit activities. Participants will not only build trail, but also bonds of brotherhood as they start their High Adventure journey.
