#### Plan Book - What's Changed?

The LEC passed a number of changes to the Lodge Plan Book at the October Lodge Executive Council Meeting. Some were "housekeeping" issues which brought different sections into line with each other, but there were some very important modifications. Some of the "highlights" are listed below:

Elections policy was altered so that unit election forms will not be accepted after the March LEC for that year's Ordeal season.

Chapter Officers section was altered to coincide with National Policy that a Chapter's Officers shall include a Chief, Vice Chief, and Secretary.

The process of electing Lodge Officers shall take place at "the first Lodge event held in the fall."

The Lodge Key 3 shall now consist of the Lodge Chief, Lodge Advisor, the Council Scout Executive or his staff designee, and the Lodge Associate Advisor.

LEC will present the Lodge annual budget no later than the January LEC, and Chapters may have expenses approved in advance by submitting an annual Chapter budget to the LEC.
