

Lodge Ordeal



Lodge Ordeal is just around the corner. The 2010 Jaccos Towne Lodge Ordeal will be held at Camp Kikthawenund from September 17-19th. This is the last chance of the year for new Arrowman to join the Order. Arrowmen can help the Lodge by encouraging those in their home troops and districts who have been elected but have not gone through the ordeal to do so at this time. The Ordeal will offer a chance for eligible members to seal their membership by obtaining Brotherhood. There will also be Vigil Honor ceremonies. Finally, at the close of the Ordeal will be new lodge officer elections for next year (see next column) and a Lodge Executive Committee Meeting. Come out and join your brothers in a weekend of fun, fellowship, and service!



2011 Officer Elections



All Arrowman running for a lodge office need to fill out a lodge intent to run form. These forms can be found under the forms section of the lodge website (crossroadsbsa.org/oa). The form is called "Lodge Officer Petition." It is important that any interested Arrowman fill the form out prior to their arrival as it requires signatures from your chapter chief, advisor, and scoutmaster and all of these people may not be at Ordeal. Elections for the offices of Lodge Chief, Lodge Vice Chief of Administration, Lodge Vice Chief of Chapters, Lodge Vice Chief of Communications, Lodge Secretary, and Lodge Treasurer will take place on Sunday morning of Ordeal. Elections for chapter positions will take place in a chapter meeting prior to November 19th. All new officers are required to attend Lodge Leadership Development which will be held December 3-5 at Camp Belzer. Finally, new lodge officers are required to attend (or have already attended) a session of National Leadership Seminar (NLS). The lodge usually sends a contingent to NLS. Any Arrowman interested in attending should speak with the Lodge Chief. If you questions about responsibilities of any office please consult the Lodge Plan Book or talk to the current officer!



OA High Adventure

OA High Adventure will be back next year and better than ever. In addition to the normal programs of Philmont Trail Crew, OA Canadian Odyssey, and Wilderness Voyage, national is introducing two new programs for the summer of 2011. These new programs are Summit Corps 2011 "The New River Experience" and Indian Summer 2011. In addition, OA Ocean Adventure will be returning in 2011 after its one year hiatus.



OA Summit Corps will be a blend of Arrow Corps⁵ and the OA's national High Adventure programs. At this event Arrowman will join in service for a week of trail repair, invasive species removal, and conservation projects in the area of the Bechtel Summit and the New River.

Indian Summer is an event dedicated to ceremonialist training and Native American culture. This event will take place in North Carolina for one week during the summer. Arrowman will get to join with brothers from all over to embrace the native cultures of America.

Order of the Arrow at Jamboree

For those scouts and scouters who went. The National Jamboree was a great and memorable experience. Amid all the great programs of the Jamboree, the Order of the Arrow ran 3 programs that were important to the general operations of the Jamboree.

The first program (and by far the most crucial to the day to day operations of the Jamboree) was the OA Service Corps. These groups of Arrowman spent their time performing service around the Jamboree. Specifically the Corps helped with set-up, tear down, and ushering at arena shows, performed conservation projects, helped fill holes in the Jamboree staff (they staffed in every area at some point during the Jamboree), and performed any other tasks that were needed. This dedicated group of Arrowman performed over 10,000 hours of service during the Jamboree alone.

At every Jamboree the OA puts on a special show. This year's show was entitled *The Mysterium Compass*. The show showed scouts how the Scout Oath and Law were crucial to their success in life (as these principles would function as their moral compass). The show was enjoyed by the scouts that participated and also included a museum of Scouting's history, and a 2-story waterslide.

The final OA Program was the Indian Village. This village was located near the Merit Badge Midway and had displays on Lewis and Clark and all the different Native American cultural groups. The area featured Native American dancers, and they had pow wows at numerous times through the week where these dancers performed. Finally, this area also served as a location where scouts could earn their Indian Lore merit badge.

If attending the Jamboree in the future is something you want to do, then staffing with the OA is a great way to go!

Summit Corps

The New River Experience will provide Arrowmen an opportunity of service at the New River Gorge National River in West Virginia. Cheerful service projects will include upgrading the trail bed of the Garden Grand Hike and Bike Trail to invasive species removal. The Garden Grand Hike and Bike Trail connects the New River Gorge National River and will run adjacent to the Boy Scout's new high adventure base and home of the Jamboree - The Summit: The Bechtel Family National Reserve. Lodge contingents have a choice of four sessions to attend - 1) July 3-9, 2) July 10-16, 3) July 17-23, and 4) July 24-30. Similar to ArrowCorps5 and our High Adventure programs, the week will consist of service and recreation opportunities.
