

Activity started Friday evening with a fast paced patch and memorabilia auction. The festive events continued on Saturday as Arrowmen of all ages strutted their stuff and showed their skill at a wide range of Indian games. Instruction in Native American dance, tipi setup and maintenance, and Indian regalia construction were offered throughout the day. Everyone had a fun time and learned about the Native American foundations of the Order of the Arrow.

In the evening, the 1993-1994 Wulakamike Lodge Officers were elected. Our new Lodge Chief is Scott Beard, while Keith Wickizer and Scott Oburn were elected as the Lodge Vice Chiefs for Program and Administration, respectively. Jason Doherty was elected Lodge Treasurer and Eric Korchnak was elected to a second term as Lodge Secretary. The evening concluded with an entertaining and spirited campfire program.

Vigil Honor recipients were recognized and their Leni Lenape names announced on Sunday. Every Arrowman returned home with memories of a good time and warm fellowship in their hearts.

NAT' ORDER OF THE ARROW CONF.

Between July 31 and August 4, 1994, over 6,000 Arrowmen and advisers will gather for the 73rd National Order of the Arrow Conference (NOAC). Our lodge will be among over 350 other lodges, to participate in this truly exciting Boy Scout event. Arrowmen will have the opportunity to receive leadership training, see exciting shows and gala American Indian events, and experience great fellowship! There will be tons of patch-trading going on. All of these have become, the hallmark of NOAC - one of the scouting events of a lifetime that every Arrowman should experience. This event will be one you do not want to miss!!!

Purdue University, one of America's 25 largest universities, will be the gathering place for Arrowmen and Advisers from around the United States. Purdue is a university which has produced many of this country's astronauts, home of Nobel Prize winners, and alma mater to numerous college and corporate presidents. For Indiana Arrowmen, this will probably be the least expensive (minimal transportation costs) and most convenient (only a few hours away) NOAC in the near future. You do not want to miss out on this opportunity!!!

The cost for these fun filled fantastic days is \$185 for youth and \$215 for adults due by April 28, 1994 in the Council office. After May 29, the conference fee will increase by \$25. These fees include lodging and meals which will be provided in the university dormitories. You don't have to pitch a tent. You don't have to cook. All you have to do is show up for the FUN!

*** IMPORTANT *** For the 1994 conference, the national Order of the Arrow committee has established a reservation quota for all lodge contingents. The quota is based on 3 1/2 percent of our lodge's December 31, 1992 year end charter membership. The ratio of youth reservations to adult reservations has been set at 2 to 1. Our lodge's reservation quota for the 1994 conference is 18 youth members and 8 adult members. We have until March 1, 1994 to fill our allocated number of youth and adult reservations. Reservations not used by March 1, 1994 will be released by national on a "first come, first served" basis only, so there will be the possibility of sending more Arrowmen from our lodge.

The Wulakamike Lodge contingent will be filled on a "first come, first served" basis. After the quota is filled, then a waiting list will be established, also on a "first come, first served" basis. Reservations must be made through the Council office, by bring or mailing the form below together with a non-refundable deposit of \$50.00 per reservation.
