#### Your choices for the new lodge name and totem are...

#### Wea Lodge 21

Wea comes from the tribe of Indians that have had settlements throughout most of the area that our new lodge occupies. For more information on the Wea tribe go to www.wea-indian-tribe.com

The totem is the Phoenix. In Greek and Roman mythology the phoenix represented immortality. Upon the death of a phoenix it would lay in a bed of fire and another phoenix would rise up from the ashes



encompassing the spirit of its fallen predecessor. When the two lodges merge the individual lodges will be no more (aka "death" of the two lodges) and in place of the previous lodges there will be on lodge ("rising from the ashes") that will retain the spirit of the previous lodges. And therefore the spirit of the Arrowmen will continue to reign as immortal.

#### **Tonawanda Lodge 21**

Tonawanda means "confluent stream" and represents the merger of two lodges moving forward together in unity. It can also represent the merger or blending of the values and ideas of scouting and OA into our daily lives.



The totem is two streams (one blue and one silver) coming together in a whirlpool pierced by a red arrow.


